2021 Historic Landscape Preservation Fundraiser



Each year the Garden Club of Georgia's Historic Landscape Preservation Committee hosts a special event to raise funds for the Garden Club's Historic Landscape Grant Program, which funds projects for historic public, non-profit landscapes and gardens throughout the state. Since its founding in 1998, the committee, comprised of preservation, landscape architecture, and tourism professionals, has awarded over \$225,000 in matching grants to nearly 100 projects in 44 Georgia counties and ALL Garden Club of Georgia Districts. It is the only grant program in the state to specifically fund the restoration of historic gardens and landscapes.

You are most cordially invited to visit Hills and Dales in LaGrange on Saturday, October 30, 2021 from 10 am – 3 pm when the Redbud District/Garden Club of Georgia hosts the 2021 fundraiser. The 13,000 square foot home, designed by Neel Reid and Hal Hentz, was completed in 1916. It flows gracefully into the historic Ferrell gardens originally designed and initiated by Sarah Ferrell in the mid-1800s. Her gardening legacy has been continued until today by four generations of the Callaway Family. Plants dating back to the 1840s, 2½ acres of formal dwarf boxwood parterres, and twenty-six different varieties of deciduous magnolias are just a few of the many delights.

This special day will feature tours of the home and gardens, a lecture by Horticulturist Jo Phillips on "Heirloom Plants for Garden Fragrance", a box lunch, and the Welcome Center with its film on Hills and Dales and gift shop. The lecture begins at 10:30 and seating is limited to 90 attendees so plan to come early to hear this topic, or you can tour the house or gardens at your leisure upon arrival. Redbud District Hosts the GCG Board



Designs were created using a grapevine ball form, sunflowers, nandina and Harry Lauder walking stick. Plant material was set in water tubes. An inverted clay saucer was used as a base to stabilize the design.

Through Plant America Grants, up to \$1,000.00 is made available to be used for direct expenses of projects. Projects submitted for receiving a grant may be a joint venture with another organization(s).

The scope of these projects in communities may include:

- Beautification and/or restoration
- Community gardens
- School gardens/classrooms
- Landscaping for Habitat for Humanity Homes
- Landscaping of Blue Star Memorial Markers
- Implementation of environmental practices
- A horticulture or environmental educational event for the public

GCG Garden Therapy Matching Grant Program

The purpose of the GCG Garden Therapy Grant Program is to fund horticultural projects that are therapeutic in nature. These projects can be either sponsored or conducted by GCG members clubs, groups of clubs, councils, or districts which provide hands-on gardening activities to either residents or members of Veteran and regional psychiatric hospitals, residential facilities, senior centers, Boys/Girls Clubs, or other noteworthy organizations. To qualify as a garden therapy project, the residents or members must be actively involved in an actual non-professional gardening or floral arranging project. Purchase of outdoor materials for raised or elevated garden beds, minigreenhouses, and/or gardening supplies may be

considered. Garden club members are required to provide oversight, monitor use of funds, and ensure that project completion occurs as planned.

Grant applications for matching funds up to \$250 must be applied for two months prior to the start of the project and may be applied for annually (May 1 to April 30). As this is a matching grant, matching funds must be documented. The funds can come from the club treasury or donations from other supporting agencies. Funds are granted throughout the year, with the April 1 application deadline. More information regarding this grant can be found at http://gardenclub.uga.edu/pdfs/gtgrantapp.pdf



What started as a sensory garden for full-time residents of the hospital has expanded to include a year-round vegetable and fruit garden. Staff members select the seasonal plants and hospital residents plant, mulch, water, and harvest the vegetables, fruits and herbs. At harvest, the patients collect the fresh produce and assist the staff in preparing delicious salads, vegetable dishes and this year making pumpkin bread. The staff also works with residents in planning and planting many container gardens for the entire campus to enjoy.





The grants from Dekalb Federation and The Garden Club of Georgia will supply needed mulch, vegetable starts for the fall garden, and seasonal flowers for the multiple containers across the campus.

This project is unique as it allows the residents to participate in the work of planting, caring and learning about plants and pollinators and companion planting. It is a wonderful way to engage the staff and residents in positive activities and the sweet reward of fresh picked vegetables and fruits along with colorful blooms for all to enjoy.

DeKalb Federation Members are "CHaRMed"

Members of DeKalb Federation enjoyed a CHaRMed presentation on September 23, 2021 from Peggy Whitlow Ratcliffe, Executive Director of The Center for Hard to Recycle Materials (CHaRM). CHaRM is a drop-off facility that collects items that cannot be disposed of via home curb pick-up. Ms. Ratcliff gave great information about the status of recycling in Georgia and the importance of recycling household items. She listed "five fab things" that will always be recycled: cardboard, mixed paper, aluminum, plastics 1 and 2 (number on triangle on bottom of plastic container) and metal.

Ms. Ratcliffe shared that the recycling industry in Georgia is second in the market for recycling manufacturing materials. She gave examples including how plastic can go to Dalton for carpet making. She also reported the aluminum cans can be recycled and back on the market within 10 days and one glass bottle can be recycled and back on the market within 96 hours. Unfortunately, the 120 recycling manufacturers in Georgia are having to get recycled materials from other states. She also elaborated about the work of Kenya's Nzambi Matee, an African woman who has been making bricks from recycled plastics, and the work of American companies looking into recycling materials used for building use.

Ms. Ratcliffe stated that her facility takes many items, including strongly recommended electronics (TVs, etc.), chemicals (cleaners, acids pesticides, and paints), Styrofoam, plastics (#s1, 2, 4, 5, and 6; straws and film), mattresses, glass, musical instruments (for refurbished for kids), and bicycles (also refurbished). Donated household goods and textiles are sent to thrift store where 100% of proceeds go to Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. Items that cannot be sold are shredded for different use. More information about CHaRM and the items they collect can be found on the ChaRM tab of the <u>livethrive.org</u> website.

Federation members were very attentive and asked many questions about recycling "dos and don'ts", appropriate places for recycling and other pertinent recycling issues. Ms. Ratcliffe encouraged DeKalb Federation members and clubs to schedule tours of the CHaRM facility and other recycling facilities.

The CHaRM facility is located at 1110 Hill Street SE, Atlanta. It is open by appointment only on Tuesday and Thursday, 9 am to 2 pm, and on Saturday, 8 am to 2 pm.
